Family Outreach – We offer a wide variety of opportunities for families to help serve those in need. These include: The Harvest Festival, held at



1pm on Sunday, October 18th; the **Be An Angel Christmas Party** held on Sunday, December 13<sup>th</sup> at 1pm; and the Pack-A-thon, held on Sunday, January 17<sup>th</sup> from 11:05 until 1*pm*, where church and school families ages two to eighty-

two work side by side to pack 20,000 healthy meals for people living in poverty around the world.

Laudemus (Latin for let us praise) – This new class is designed for 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> graders as part of The Discovery Hour and will be taught by the Rev. Lara Stroud. It will help children jump into "big" church by teaching them about worship through our interactive sessions focusing on music, liturgy and movement. Participants will meet in the chapel, explore the whole church and learn how to become active worshippers, able to ask questions and practice various roles.



First Steps to Worship – This (30-minute) worship service meets each Sunday in Haas Hall, conveniently located behind the church, from 10:15 – 10:45am for families with children six and under. Older siblings and grandparents are welcome. This popular service is fun and easy and a great place to make new friends and help your family encounter God's love.

Family Worship – Each Sunday, we endeavor to make our 10 a.m. service in the church relevant to families as we include children and youth in worship leadership. Whether it's the St. Francis Choir or the Choristers singing, a sermon that speaks to the needs of the family, collecting food to be blessed at the altar to share with the poor or having a youth read Scripture lessons aloud, the focus is on the family.

**Faith at Five** – This family-friendly 40-minute service is held in the church each Sunday from September to May at 5:00*pm*. St. Thomas' has a wonderful and friendly program with gifted teachers. We welcome your children to be part of this starting at age four through high school. It takes place from 11:05am – noon, directly after the 10 a.m. service and the end of First Steps to Worship and is held in the School House, which is located across from the Parish House where the St. Thomas' Nursery School is located.

The Family Forum, The Sunday Faith Forum and 6x4x1 – Wondering what you would do while your children attend The Discovery Hour? Our Family Forum is designed for young parents and adults to explore what it means to have faith and how faith in Christ affect our lives, offering group discussions about resonant issues and the joy of a life lived in Christ. The Sunday Faith Forum offers a variety of speakers on relevant and stimulating issues of faith. Twice a year, we interrupt the Sunday Forum to offer 6x4x1, offering six smaller classes for four weeks, allowing participants to explore a variety of interesting themes more deeply.



Children's Music – St. Thomas' offers one of the most comprehensive children's music programs of any church in the region, and it's all free. In addition to our wonderful Minister of Music Derrick Goff, we have recently hired Allison Miller as our Assistant Minister of Music for Children. After studying at the Westminster Choir College in Princeton, Allison has been teaching music professionally in elementary schools. She now comes to us to help our St. Francis Choir (children in kindergarten to third grade) and our Choristers (fourth to eighth grade,) discover the joy of singing.
